Review of minutes: Minutes were not available from the September meeting.

### Agency Updates:

1. State Budget: A contract has been signed for the money for the CEG and the monies are being released. Head Start is getting their PreK classes opened and operational. In some instances this is expanding hours of classes already open. State funded Head Start slots will be opening soon and the federally funded expansion will start in January.
2. The Lycoming CEG and the Clinton CEG are going to collaborate on a community leaders breakfast February 26, 2010. This will help fulfill goals of the CEG grant.
3. Traumatic Brain Injury presentation October 27. 44 people registered and 36 attended. There were no coaches present and perhaps a specific presentation during an in-service would be a way to get the information to coaches. The information presented highlighted the long term consequences of falls. Perhaps some outreach to businesses would also be appropriate.
4. Transition Event October 23: This was a very successful event. All kindergarten classes in Keystone Central were represented and most of the child care facilities. The next step is a follow up meeting in the spring to continue with information sharing and coordinating. Lock Haven University is very interested in writing a grant proposal to get funds to do a kindergarten screening event and use LHU students to provide the staffing.
5. Infant Development Program: Carla Ritz is the new Executive Director. She has experience with non-profits and has relocated here from Tennessee. IDP has DPW inspection next week for their child care license.
6. CIU#10: They are a PELICAN pilot. Training will be in February the same time as transition meetings. They are also recipients of two grants and Assistive Technology grant and a Positive Behavior Support grant. The AT grant involves a team of 12 with a
